History:

Poornaprajna Education Centre has been established by His Holiness Sri Vibudeshateertha Swamiji, the then Pontiff of Sri Admar Mutt, Udupi and Founder President, Udupi Sri Admar Mutt Education Council. The Centre flourished under his guidance and he was an ever source of inspiration. The school is affiliated with the Karnataka State Education Board and follows the Karnataka State Syllabus. Over the last five decades, it has been recognized worldwide for its unique curriculum and teaching practices. We are a mainstream, coeducational and culturally inclined institution.

Infrastructure:

The School is located in a beautiful locality with a large playground in its vicinity. It has well-equipped laboratories, a modern Library, Audio Visuals, Computers and Art & Craft Sections. The Centre is facilitated with musical Instruments for orchestra. All the classrooms have been equipped with smart boards for teaching and raining all the subjects more effectively.

To bring awareness of the need and possibilities of pollution-free green energy to the children, alternative natural sources of energy like Solar panels and windmills have been installed on the terrace. An 82.5KV Generator has been installed on the premises, as a power backup to ensure the uninterrupted functioning of all the departments. The infrastructure and facilities for imparting quality education are being continuously upgraded in the School.

Scholastic Curriculum:

The core objective of the Centre is to enable the students to grow freely in a clean and healthy surrounding, developing their inherent qualities and instilling a sense of righteousness, discipline and duty to society and to the Motherland.

The curriculum is designed to reflect the philosophy of the Founder, HH Sri Vibudeshateertha Swamiji which is a continuous and meaningful process. Focusing on the learner-centred approach the activities are designed to tap the utmost innate abilities of the child. Hence the pedagogy is based on the 5 C's of learning- Critical thinking, Creativity, Communication, Collaboration and Character building.

The school has classes from Nursery to Preparatory 2 in the Pre-Primary section, I to VII Standard in the Primary Section and VIII to X in the High School Section respectively. While the Pre-Primary Section has only one session, the other sections work in two sessions. The day of the school commences with the Assembly and prayer.

Pre-Primary Section:

The Pre-primary section follows a unique rotation system wherein children move from one activity room to another according to the timetable. This was devised by the founder President HH Sri Vibudeshateertha Swamiji, as the children in these age groups exhibit limited attention span.

Bhagavad Gita is being taught to the Preparatory 1 and 2 children. This helps in enhancing their memory, concentration and voice modulation. Festivals like Dassaraotsava and Deepotsava are celebrated in school to instil values in the children. Various exhibitions like grains, fruits and vegetables are organized to enhance the children's knowledge of things around them.

Primary Section:

As Primary education is the basic right of every child, at the primary level, emphasis is laid on developing their social, cognitive, cultural, emotional and physical skills according to their abilities.

We strive to reinforce different concepts, ideas and skills packed with exciting activities to comprehend what is being done in the classroom. The subjects in our Primary Section curriculum include 1st language (English), 2nd language (Kannada), 3rd language Hindi or Sanskrit, Mathematics, Environmental Science, General Science and Social Studies for classes 1 to 7. We conduct Talents Day every year, to identify different talents in students.

Club activity competitions comprising of street plays, role plays, recitation, story telling are conducted to endorse the student's understanding of the languages.

High School Section:

Our comprehensive curriculum in high school includes subjects such as English, Kannada, Hindi/Sanskrit, General Science, General Maths, Social Science, Students in 8th, 9th, and 10th standard use textbooks prepared in accordance with NCERT norms. To enrich their learning experience, we conduct activities suggested in these textbooks and NCERT books.

Apart from the prescribed textbooks and instructions from the education department, the curriculum embeds the learner's theories from Bloom's Taxonomy and Howard Gardner's Multiple Intelligence to nurture the aptitude. Overall the learner experiences the freedom and flexibility interwoven with values and beliefs which is the essence of education.

Assessments:

The assessment structure and examination for classes I to X comprises two terms, Term-1 and Term-2. We conduct 4 formative assessments and 2 summative assessments throughout the year to monitor the progress of our students. The children are observed during their classes and a Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation Report is also maintained.

Assessments/Evaluations are conducted according to a uniform system of assessment guidelines by the State Government. Preparatory Examinations are conducted for class X to prepare the students for the SSLC Board Examination. Parents are called for meetings periodically to appreciate and to discuss the scope of improvement in their wards.

Co-Scholastic Curriculum of Primary and High School Section:

The Student Association which comprises clubs like Literary, Humanities, Science, Astrophysics, philately and Music empowers students to organise various activities for the student members after school hours between 3:10 pm to 3:40 pm.

To instil a sense of leadership and to develop social responsibility, the students in the Primary Section enroll in Cubs/bulbuls and Scouts Guides. The activities are well-planned and executed by a team of trained teachers.

In terms of sports and fitness, coaching is offered by experts in Throwball, Volleyball, and Basketball. Physical Education classes including drills and displays are held on Saturdays. The School Band also trains students to perform during National Festivals and formal School functions.

The school encourages students to participate in Competitive Examinations like NSTSE & Olympiads, Science Exhibitions, Seminars, Arts and Craft competitions, Literary Competitions, Debates, Sports and Athletics conducted by the public and private bodies.

To enhance Life skills, we train students in Sewing, Knitting, Embroidery & Cooking for which we have a dedicated Work Experience Room for Primary and High School. Students are also introduced to Basic Electronics, Electricals, Mechanical work, Carpentry and Plumbing in the specially equipped Vocational Training Centre of the School. Computer Science lab facility is available with advanced technology for all the students.

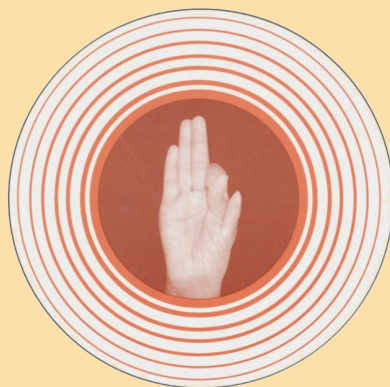
At Poornaprajna, we firmly believe that education should empower students to excel academically while also equipping them with the skills, values and experiences needed for a fulfilling and successful life.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO PARENTS OF PRE - PRIMARY SECTION

1. Parents are generally called to discuss about the daily performance of their wards, for a one to one interaction, preferably on Saturdays.
2. When a child needs immediate help / correction the parent may be called on any working day with one day's prior information.
3. With regard to Class Programme and Annual Day the parent can be called on any day for the necessities.
4. For participation in competitions and events outside the school parents may be called on a short notice.
5. Regarding health issues, un-informed leave and repeated soiling of their clothes parents to discuss with the class teacher.
6. Submissions of Home Work, Class Work, Diaries, Activity Sheets, Library books and such must be regular.
7. Class work / Diary must be duly signed when sent for signature.
8. Irregularity in attendance and failing in submission of leave letters and Medical Certificates when required (Sickness exceeding 3 days requires a Certificate of Fitness from the Doctor attending), will not be allowed.
9. Children to be dropped and picked up at the right time everyday. This will be their first step to inculcate DISCIPLINE in the child.
10. Parents to oblige and comply with the teachers. In case there is a difficulty in coming on the appointed day, a letter addressed to the Class teacher should be sent mentioning their convenience, which must be at the earliest, in the interest of the child.
11. Diaries are meant for the teachers to send information, as they are in the school. Parents may communicate in the diary, when memos are sent.
12. Parents can meet the Teachers only after 12:10 pm on any day. They are available till 12.50 pm. On Saturdays between 9:00 am to 11:00 am if they need to. Meeting teachers during class hours is STRICTLY PROHIBITED.
13. Gold and silver ornaments of any kind are not permitted. Tattoo and Nail polish must not be used. Nails must be trimmed short.
14. Avoid discussing anything negative about the school, Teaching Staff and helpers in front of the child. Issues if any can be sorted out by the School authorities. Also don't compare children.
15. As the medium of instruction is in English, your child should be helped to follow his/her lessons easily and intelligently by a certain amount of English conversation at home.
16. Parents should regularly follow the food schedule in the interest of the children.
17. It is mandatory to show the hard copy of the child's ID card to the teacher while picking up the child from school.

18. Parents are requested to intimate the teachers of any change of address or change of telephone no, so that they may be contacted quickly in case of necessity / emergency.
19. Parents are requested not to park their vehicles in front of the school gates in order to avoid inconvenience to staff, students and general public.
20. Application for Transfer Certificate shall be submitted to the Headmistress on or before 25th April every year. Applicants seeking Transfer Certificate on or after 26th April shall pay the full fees for the next academic year, to be eligible to obtain Transfer Certificate. When an application is received from the parents (with both Father and mother's signatures) for a Transfer Certificate, it will be issued only after presenting the NOC received from the accounts section and class teachers.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO PARENTS OF PRIMARY AND HIGH SCHOOL

LEAVE RULES

It must be noted that, no leave will be granted except when applied for in writing by the parent or guardian giving valid reasons for the absence. Prior permission must be taken from the Principal for leave of more than 2 days. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than seven days is liable to result in the name of the student being struck off the rolls.

Re-admission in such cases may be granted, subject to vacancy and only on payment of all dues. It is compulsory for students to put in a minimum of 75% attendance in the year. Parents are requested not to take their children away from the school during working days.

A Student returning to school after suffering from any infectious or contagious disease should produce a Doctor's certificate. He / she must observe the prescribed quarantine period before returning to school. An application for leave by the parent must be attached to the medical certificate.

Please send lunch with your children. If, for any reason, your child forgets to bring his/her lunch, kindly hand it over with a slip bearing the student's name, class and section to the security at the main gate.

VISITING HOURS

Parents can meet the Principal or the Subject Teachers after school hours on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Parents are requested not to disturb the teachers or go to their classes during school hours. For any emergency parents may contact the school office to obtain permission from the Principal.

GENERAL INSTRUCTION TO ALL STUDENTS IN PRE-PRIMARY, PRIMARY & HIGH SCHOOL SECTIONS

An amount of Rs.30/- shall be collected as fine for wearing wrong uniform/untidy uniform.

RULES FOR ADMISSIONS & WITHDRAWAL

RULES OF ADMISSIONS

Poornaprajna Education Centre, Sadashivanagar is affiliated to Karnataka State Education and Examination Board. The academic session is between May and April.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- ♦ The Parents/Guardians seeking admission for their wards shall apply online in the month of October/November for Pre-Primary Classes & in March for Primary & High School section. A strict advice to the parents by the management is not to contact any touts or middle men for admission. Parents doing so shall risk admission into school.
- ♦ The Age Criteria for admission needs to be ascertained before applying for the appropriate grades. (Details are available on the application).
- ♦ At the time of filling the application, relevant documents need to be uploaded to facilitate the admission procedure. The Parents/Guardians are instructed to fill-in the admission forms with utmost accuracy. No changes will be permitted thereafter, for any reason whatsoever as the same needs to be submitted to the education department.
- ♦ While countersigning the certificates, the Educational Officers should record an endorsement that the migration has been permitted. Otherwise, such pupils will not be admitted to the centre. The Management reserves the right to specify the class to which the pupils are to be admitted in the light of such qualifying tests as may be prescribed.

SELECTION AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ♦ After screening the received application, parents will be informed through an email. Only such candidates along with both the parents will be eligible to sit for the interactive/admission test.
- ♦ This is followed by an interactive session for the Pre-Primary classes & admission tests for higher classes. The interactive/admission test is compulsory for all candidates seeking fresh admission to school. No candidate will be admitted unless he/she has appeared in the test and qualified for the class to which admission is sought. Admission to school shall be done only after the prescribed fees are paid in full.

NOTE:

- ♦ A transfer certificate (TC) from previous school is mandatory for the applicants seeking admission for primary and high school.

Admission to the School is sole prerogative of the Management.

WITHDRAWAL BY PARENTS

- (a) Application for Transfer Certificate shall be submitted to the Principal on or before 25th April every year. NOC is required from accounts section and class teachers to proceed with the Transfer Certificate process.**
- (b) When an application is received from the parents (with both Father and mother's signatures) for a Transfer Certificate, it will be issued only after all the fee due has been paid. Please refer to the Refund Policy Section for further details.**
- (c) Withdrawal for poor Academic performance: One failure for an academic session will be permitted for the student to repeat the class. Students who have failed for the second time will not be permitted to continue in the school.**
- (d) If any students' conduct behavior or influence, in the opinion of the Principal is detrimental to the general discipline/interest of the school, then the principal will report such matters to the Management immediately for the withdrawal of the student.**

DISCIPLINE POLICY

Discipline is a process which involves acknowledgement for acceptable behaviour. In Poornaprajna, discipline and good conduct in children include accepting responsibility for their own actions. Acceptable behaviour will contribute to a school that is pleasant and conducive to learning.

We aim at guiding the students:

1. To adhere to the rules and regulations of the school and in turn to that of the society.
2. To do what is right and what is acceptable.
3. To form one's conscience to be silent, obedient, attentive for the benefit of all.
4. It is compulsory for every student to attend the Morning assembly.
5. Students should pay obeisance to Poojya Swamiji whenever he visits the school.
6. Students should always greet the Management, Principal, Teachers, visitors, elders and friends in an amiable and audible tone of voice, whenever and wherever they meet them in school or outside.
7. Malpractice during examinations will be dealt severely.
8. Any student who is found to tamper with marks in the progress report and other school certificates will be asked to leave the school.
9. Students and parents are not permitted to offer any gifts to Teachers or any other person employed in the school.
10. Students are forbidden to bring to school, any items like expensive/smart wrist watch, cell phone/laptop etc apart from their note books, textbooks, stationery items and lunch. All other items will be confiscated. Such students will be dealt with seriously as deemed fit by the Principal.

11. Criticism of any kind, about the Institution or teachers is strictly forbidden.
12. All students should have lunch in the school premises only during Lunch break. They are strictly forbidden to buy eatables from street vendors.
13. Bicycles must be parked and locked in the areas allocated for parking bicycles in the school. The school will not hold itself responsible for lost, damaged or stolen bicycles.
14. Ornaments of any kind, expensive wrist watches and makeup, tattoo or henna on the hand is not permitted. Nails must be trimmed short. Nail polish must not be used.

GENERAL FEE RULES

1. Tuition fee is charged for all the twelve months of the Academic year and must be paid half yearly on or before the 10th of the first month of the respective half year (i.e. May and December) between 9:00 am and 1:30 pm from Monday to Saturday.
2. Names of students whose fee remains unpaid for any one half year, will be struck off the rolls. If they are readmitted, they must pay all the fee including the admission fee.
3. Students attending school for part of a month must pay the tuition and other fee as prescribed. For further details refer to the Refund Policy Section.
4. On no account shall a Transfer Certificate be granted to a student who has not paid all arrears of fee.
5. **Payment of fees is only through online.**

6. During vacations, the Office is open between 10.00 am and 01.00 pm on all working days. However, the designated hours for facilitating online fee payments are from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon, from Monday to Saturday.

REFUND POLICY

REFUND POLICY FOR EXISTING STUDENTS

1. If admission is withdrawn before April of a financial year, entire fee paid shall be refunded.
2. If admission is withdrawn in the month of May of the financial year, Tuition fee for the month of May and 10% of the Annual fee, comprising of term and lease fee shall be deducted as processing fee.
3. If admission is withdrawn in the month of June or July of the financial year, 3 months Tuition fee shall be deducted for service rendered and 100% of Annual fee comprising of term and lease fee shall be deducted as processing fee.
4. If admission is withdrawn after August of the financial year, Tuition fee shall be refunded after appropriate deduction upto the month the child is being withdrawn for the services rendered and there shall be no refund of the Annual fees.

REFUND POLICY FOR NEW ADMISSION

1. If admission is withdrawn before April of a financial year, entire fee paid shall be refunded by deducting 10% as processing fee.
2. If admission is withdrawn in the month of May of the financial year, Tuition fee for the month of May and 10% of the Annual fee, comprising of term and lease fee shall be deducted as processing fee.
3. If admission is withdrawn in the month of June or July of the financial year, 3 months Tuition fee shall be deducted for service rendered and 100% of Annual fee comprising of term and lease fee shall be deducted as processing fee.
4. If admission is withdrawn after August of the financial year, Tuition fee shall be refunded after appropriate deduction upto the month the child is being withdrawn for the services rendered and there shall be no refund of the Annual fees.
